Resolution No. 27-91

RESOLUTION


- WHEREAS, the Comanche Tribe of Oklahoma is a federally recognized Tribe with a Constitution approved by Secretary of the Interior, on the 9th day of January 1967, and
- WHEREAS, the Comanche Tribe of Oklahoma has been mandated within its Tribal Constitution that the Comanche Business Committee assist it's people in their social, economic, health, cultural development, and
- WHEREAS, the Comanche Business Committee on May 19, 1987, in Resolution No. 28-87, voted to fully support Public Law 99-570, the Indian Alcohol, Substance Abuse, Prevention and Treatment Act of 1986, by proclaiming that alcoholism, alcohol and substance abuse as the most severe health and social problem facing Native Americans, and
- WHEREAS, the Comanche Tribe of Oklahoma finds that alcoholism, alcohol and substance abuse severely affects the physical, mental, social, and economic well being of its tribal members, and
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Comanche Business Committee fully supports the Human Service Department in re-applying for the continuation of funding for a Halfway House for Indian men and women, known known as New Pathways, through the Indian Health Service. Effective start-up date of program will be October 1, 1991.

CERTIFICATION

The above resolution was fully adopted at a regular monthly meeting of the Comanche Business Committee held at the Comanche Tribal Complex, Lawton, Oklahoma on Sept. 7, 1991 by a majority vote of 6 for, 0 against, with a quorum being present.
