



**RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE CREATION, SUBMISSION, AND APPROVAL OF
PRESCRIPTION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM CNG GUIDELINES**

WHEREAS, the Comanche Nation is a federally recognized Indian Tribe with a Constitution approved by the Secretary of the Interior of the United States on January 9, 1967, to safeguard tribal rights, powers and privileges to improve the economic, moral, educational, and health status of its members; and

WHEREAS, the Comanche Constitution, Article VI, Section 7(f), provides that the Comanche Business Committee has the authority to implement, administer, and report on progress of programs adopted by the Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, some Comanche Nation tribal government departments and programs who receive only CNG funding, did not have CNG Guidelines established within, to provide employees and directors a reference or guide for client services provided to tribal members, nor a reference or guide that assisted the department or program in improving quality and performance of those client services; and

WHEREAS, CNG Guidelines are crucial for ensuring consistency, improving quality, and promoting efficiency across various fields, plus, they provide clear instructions, standards, rules, and recommendations, helping individuals and organizations achieve desired outcomes for client services; and

WHEREAS, by adhering to CNG Guidelines, directors and employees can make informed decisions, reduce errors, reduce service denials, produce more approvals, and maintain a high level of performance within; and

WHEREAS, certain departments and programs may require amendments to their CNG Guidelines in the future if services are modified, added, or removed, and any revisions or updates to the CNG Guidelines shall be processed through this same Resolution as amendments; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Comanche Business Committee hereby adopts the CNG Guidelines for the Prescription Assistance Program that were created and submitted by March 1st, 2025 and finalized by September 2nd, 2025 by a subcommittee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that exceptions to these guidelines may **only** be granted with the written and signed approval of both the Tribal Administrator and Executive Financial Officer; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, an exception report for the Prescription Program must be sent to the Comanche Business Committee each month; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any and all prior resolutions in conflict with the adoption and implementation of these CNG Guidelines are hereby null and void.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, the Comanche Business Committee, acting for and on behalf of the Comanche Nation, does hereby authorize this Resolution for such intent.


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CERTIFICATION

PRESCRIPTION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

CNG Guidelines

Mission Statement:

At Comanche Nation Prescription Assistance Program, we are in the unique position to be able to help our Comanche people where help is needed most. So “Do more. Feel better. Live longer.” it's not just a motto, it is our pledge to you that we will do our utmost to help our people live healthier, fuller lives. We do so through The Comanche Nation Prescription Assistance.

Program Overview:

Comanche Nation Prescription Assistance Program is a supplemental program. As a supplemental program the goal is to assist in the basic medical needs of enrolled tribal members. There are no age limit or income guidelines. It is the responsibility of the client to get all the necessary documents when applying for assistance. Special cases will be at the discretion of the Director.

Services Provided:

- Hearing Aid (1 ear)
 - ✓ \$500.00 (once every 3 years)
- Dental/Orthodontic Procedures
 - ✓ Up to \$1,000.00 (once every 2 years)
 - ✓ This includes fillings, dentures, partials, braces, etc.
- Non-Diabetic Medication
 - ✓ Up to \$125.00 (every 30 days)
- Medical Supplies
 - ✓ Such as ostomy supplies, gauze, tape, etc.
 - ✓ Up to \$125.00 (every 30 days)
- Nutritional Supplements
 - ✓ “Ensure” - (1) case (every 30 days)
- Adult Protective Underwear
 - ✓ Two (2) packages (every 30 days)
 - ✓ Two (2) packages of Bed Pads (every 30 days)
- Medical Equipment/Assistive Devices (once every 3 years)
 - ✓ Wheelchair: Standard – Up to \$450.00
 - Bariatric: Up to \$800.00
 - ✓ Walker, Walker Rollator, Cane, etc.
 - ✓ Nebulizer: Standard
 - ✓ Bedside Commodes/Raisers: Standard
 - ✓ Shower Chairs: Standard
 - ✓ Transfer Bench: Standard; Bariatric

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- ✓ Medical Prescribed Therapeutic Mattress: Up to \$800.00
- ✓ CPAP Equipment
 - Up to \$1,000.00
 - Sleep Study required
- Electric Scooter
 - ✓ Up to \$1,200.00
- Miscellaneous Equipment
 - ✓ Braces for arm, leg, and knees, canes, tens unit, mattress, compression stockings, sleeves for amputees, etc.
- Repairs on Equipment
 - ✓ Will be based on individual need up to \$300.00

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must submit a CDIB card or submit tribal enrollment letter
- Must submit a completed service application
- Must submit a Valid Prescription
- Must submit a Letter from the Dentist
- All Diabetics must utilize the Diabetes Program before applying or requesting assistance from the Prescription Assistance Program.

Applications will not be processed until all required documentation is submitted.

Incomplete applications will be held for at least 30 days.

Services contingent upon funding availability.
