



**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE CREATION, SUBMISSION, AND APPROVAL OF
REINTEGRATION PROGRAM CNG GUIDELINES**

WHEREAS, the Comanche Nation is a federally recognized Indian Tribe with a Constitution approved by the Secretary of the Interior of the United States on January 9, 1967, to safeguard tribal rights, powers and privileges to improve the economic, moral, educational, and health status of its members; and

WHEREAS, the Comanche Constitution, Article VI, Section 7(f), provides that the Comanche Business Committee has the authority to implement, administer, and report on progress of programs adopted by the Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, some Comanche Nation tribal government departments and programs who receive only CNG funding, did not have CNG Guidelines established within, to provide employees and directors a reference or guide for client services provided to tribal members, nor a reference or guide that assisted the department or program in improving quality and performance of those client services; and

WHEREAS, CNG Guidelines are crucial for ensuring consistency, improving quality, and promoting efficiency across various fields, plus, they provide clear instructions, standards, rules, and recommendations, helping individuals and organizations achieve desired outcomes for client services; and

WHEREAS, by adhering to CNG Guidelines, directors and employees can make informed decisions, reduce errors, reduce service denials, produce more approvals, and maintain a high level of performance within; and

WHEREAS, certain departments and programs may require amendments to their CNG Guidelines in the future if services are modified, added, or removed, and any revisions or updates to the CNG Guidelines shall be processed through this same Resolution as amendments; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Comanche Business Committee hereby adopts the CNG Guidelines for Reintegration Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that exceptions to these guidelines may **only** be granted with the written and signed approval of both the Tribal Administrator and Executive Financial Officer; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, an exception report for the Reintegration Program must be sent to the Comanche Business Committee each month; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any and all prior resolutions in conflict with the adoption and implementation of these CNG Guidelines are hereby null and void.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, the Comanche Business Committee, acting for and on behalf of the Comanche Nation, does hereby authorize this Resolution for such intent.

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
CERTIFICATION

Reintegration Program

CNG Guidelines

Mission Statement:

“The Mission of the Comanche Nation Reintegration Program is to empower the personal transformation of incarcerated, or formerly incarcerated individuals, by facilitating help for the resources and services needed to establish and maintain a healthy, productive, crime free, prosperous life.”

Services Provided:

Upon application approval, the following services and financial assistance may be provided for Comanche Tribal Members in and out of the service area:

- Clothing up to \$200.00 for adults;
- Personal hygiene items up to \$25.00;
- Groceries up to \$75.00;
- Household items up to \$100.00;
- Payment and assistance for retrieval of official, and personal, identification documents (birth certificate, State ID card, CDIB card, diplomas, certificates, etc.) up to \$50.00;
- Housing/shelter assistance (deposits, utilities, rent, etc.), up to \$1,000.00 per - year, not to exceed \$1,000.00 in a 12-month period;
- Assessments and subsequent requirements for driver's license reinstatement up to \$1,000.00 (this is a one-time service only);
- Driver's license reinstatement fees up to \$1,000.00, must provide proof of verifiable employment (this is a one-time service only);
- Commissary items such as cultural, faith-based, educational, and/or recovery-based literature, work-related clothes or boots, hygiene products, regular clothes, etc. for incarcerated tribal members, one time per year not to exceed \$300.00 in a 12-month period;
- Counseling services up to \$600.00 per year;
- Substance Abuse treatment up to \$500.00 per year;
- Installation only of the Interlock Ignition Device up to \$250.00, must provide proof of verifiable employment (this is a one-time service only);
- Court-ordered requirements/classes not otherwise listed, up to \$750.00 per year;
- Transportation via Comanche Nation Transit up to 2 passes per year; transportation may also include providing gasoline for job searches and employment related activities up to two times per year not to exceed \$100.00 in a 12-month period;

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- Emergency transportation to return to home state residence (i.e., bus ticket) up to \$400.00; and
- Application fee for the ICOTS (Interstate Compact Offender Tracking Systems) application - up to \$250.00 (this is a one-time only service);
- Driving School services up to \$500.00.
- Assistance with job searches, resume building, and other employment/career related activities.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be an enrolled Comanche Nation Tribal Member.
- Adult applicants must be currently incarcerated or have been released from incarceration within the last 12 months (must provide documentation).
- Length of incarceration must be 90 days or longer for eligible tribal members.
- Applicant must complete an application for the Comanche Nation Reintegration Program and provide requested supporting documentation.

Supporting Documentation:

- Certificate of Indian Blood (CDIB) Comanche Tribal Member.
- Proof of Incarceration documentation (Discharge Paper, Certificate of Release, etc.)

*Applications will not be processed until required documents are submitted.

**Incomplete applications will be held for at least 30 days.

***The Comanche Nation Reintegration Program will not pay for fines, court costs, probation fees, restitution, legal fees, or any other court related costs.

****Services are contingent upon funding availability.
